

#### General Description of the Facility

The Meadows Racetrack and Casino turned to a new chapter in its long and storied history. As part of a Real Estate Investment Trust, in September 2016 the property was sold to Gaming and Leisure Properties, Incorporated with Pinnacle Entertainment Corporation leasing the operations of the facility. Pinnacle operates fifteen properties in the United States, including horse racing venues Belterra Park in Ohio and Retama Park in Texas.

The modern era of The Meadows dates to April 15, 2009, The Meadows Racetrack and Casino opened a state-of-the-art-facility serving as a premier entertainment destination in Southwestern Pennsylvania. However, unlike Wheeling Island and Mountaineer Park in West Virginia, where racing and gaming are held in separate buildings, The Meadows brought all of the excitement into one grand structure. The Meadows razed its outdated 1963 grandstand and during construction, temporarily operated slots and racing in separate facilities. The integrated harness racing, slots, table games, bowling, poker and various bars and restaurants into one venue has proven to be a successful business model.

The provides a larger apron area allowing for greater events on the tracks' most prominent days, including Adios Day, the Adios Eliminations, concerts, and the Triple Crown events. During the summer months, race fans watch live harness racing outside from the 500 seat open air grandstand, close up on the apron or from the Terrace Café Patio or Bistecca outdoor lounge where fans enjoy the sights and sounds of live racing, without having to peer through the glass panes of the older designed grandstand.



The track level of the facility houses a Racebook featuring 72 individual betting carrels and over 100 flat screen televisions. The Racebook also features room for 18 clerks, provides self-service wagering terminals and allows quick access to the apron and Racetrack. Also in the Racebook is Delvins snack bar. Named for harness racing icon and Meadows' founder, Delvin Miller, the snack bar offers various food options, as well as alcoholic and non-alcoholic beverages. Scating in Delvins is separated from the apron only by glass doors and windows. Directly outside of Delvins is popular open air seating, located both under cover and along the finish line.

Residing on the Racebook level are Meadows Lanes bowling lanes and the Triple Crown Events Rooms. Both of these lower level locations offer full service bars. These venues are easily accessible from the Racebook and provide opportunity for racing to acquire new fans. Meadows Lanes hosts multiple bowling leagues from the Washington area, producing new foot traffic through the Racebook. The Triple Crown Rooms (named for the Kentucky Derby, Preakness, and Belmont) and located in the former Poker Room location, allow a diverse group of people to experience the racing through gatherings, corporate events, meetings, wedding receptions, catered events, fairs and expos held in the rooms. The retractable walls between the rooms allow for great flexibility in size and configuration. With the move of the Poker Room upstairs to the

Casino level, the entire Racebook level track apron, Food Court and Bistecca are open to those 18 years of age or older. Minors must be accompanied by a parent.

On the Casino level, the harness track serves as the main focal point of the property.

Giant windows in the facility open to the track with outdoor dining available from both the signature Bistecca Steakhouse, as well as the main restaurant, Terrace Café. Both the 200 seat Bistecca and the 300 seat Carvery Restaurant, renovated in May 2014, provide an elevated view overlooking the track. The 300 seat Food Court overlooks the Racetrack as well.

Another racing friendly aspect of the Casino is the ability to place wagers, not just from the Racebook, but from multiple locations on several floors. On the Casino level, a pari-mutuel window provides customers with quick and easy wagering access through a clerk on the floor. In the Food Court, several self-service terminals permit wagering access to customers. In Bistecca, during live racing, mobile tellers take wagers from customers allowing dining patrons to place wagers and watch the races from the comfort of their trackside tables. Self-service wagering terminals provide betting access to the private suites and Cigar Bar also located on the steakhouse level.

In addition to the Triple Crown Rooms and the Skyboxes overlooking the race track named for great harness racing horses or stallions, the racing theme is injected into The Meadows' premier players' room, which is named after Adios, the Delvin Miller-owned stallion and Racetracks' signature event.



In order for race fans to have easy access to the facility, there are two parking garages.

One is located next to the racing entrance and the track level is just a short escalator or elevator ride down.

From the onset, and through current operations, The Meadows Racetrack and Casino's ownership continues to prove a commitment toward redevelopment of harness racing in Southwestern Pennsylvania.

#### FOILED AGAIN RETURNS TO THE MEADOWS, HEADLINES BIG SATURDAY CARD

WASHINGTON, PA, June 3, 2016 — Foiled Again, harness racing's richest horse, has accomplished many things in his distinguished career. The amazing 12-year-old has banked more than \$7.3 million, won Pacer of the Year honors (2011) and been named Best Older Male Pacer in three consecutive seasons (2011-2013).

The one thing he hasn't done, at least in the last couple years: race at The Meadows, the home track of his trainer, Ron Burke, and owners Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Bruscemi LLC and JJK Stables. Foiled Again will check off that item Saturday when he competes in an \$18,000 Preferred Handicap, leaving from post 6 with Yannick Gingras. The Preferred goes as race 1, post time 1 PM.

Saturday's exciting card also features two stakes for 3-year-old colt and gelding pacers: the Bye Byrd, a \$162,110 Pennsylvania Sires Stake, and a \$100,000 PA Stallion Series event. The stakes encompass the final seven races on the 14-race program.

With his heavy travel schedule, Foiled Again has raced fewer than a handful of times at The Meadows, most recently about three years ago.

"It was on Adios Day, and he was parked every step," Burke recalls. "He got beat at the wire and finished second."

He's still taking on top competition and performing creditably at an age when most horses are long retired. Yet this year, Foiled Again is winless in eight starts. Burke thought the Preferred might be an opportunity for Foiled Again to regroup.

"It's harder for him to get going now," Burke said. "When you give him a break, it's harder for him to find everything. We wanted to give him a chance against horses that are different than those he usually races against."

But Saturday's Preferred features some tough customers, including Unlocked from the Norm Parker stable, who's already won more than \$76,000 this year; Dapper Dude, a recent acquisition by Rence Bercury who captured his first start for his new connections,

and Brian Brown's Lost For Words, deprived of the 2015 Little Brown Jug title by the dramatic, improbable stretch drive of Wiggle it Jiggleit.

"The race came up tougher than I'd hoped. It looks like it will take 1:49 to win," Burke said. "But in the last couple weeks, he's looked more like himself. Saturday will be a little reminder of the horse he can be."

He said Foiled Again would be pointed to the June 19 Roll With Joe at Tioga Downs if he performs well Saturday and has a full stakes schedule thereafter.

"I think this year, he'll have to race more just to get in shape," Burke said. "He'll probably race 25 times, maybe even a start or two more than that. He trained at The Meadows on Wednesday and couldn't have been better."

In the Bye Byrd, Burke will send out six horses — three in each division. He considers Check Six, winner of all four of his starts and \$328,443 this year, his best shot.

"All six are very competitive, but he looks like our premier colt," Burke said. "If we're to win any big races this year, it will have to be with him."

Check Six leaves from post 6 with Gingras in race 8.

# RACING HILL, MANHATTAN BEACH WIN ADIOS ELIMINATIONS AT THE MEADOWS

WASHINGTON, PA, July 23, 2016 — Racing Hill, the 1-5 favorite, overpowered the field as he captured his elimination in the 50<sup>th</sup> edition of the Delvin Miller Adios Pace for the Orchids in 1:49.1, while Manhattan Beach found late racing room to take Saturday's other \$25,000 elimination at The Meadows.

Those two will be joined in next Saturday afternoon's \$400,000 Adios final by Check Six, Lyons Snyder, More Dragon, Fernando Hanover, Another Daily Copy, American Passport and Big Top Hanover. Big Top Hanover earned his berth in the field of nine as the fifth place finisher with higher career earnings. Five of the six entrants trained by Ron Burke made it through to the final.

The draw for Adios post positions is set for Tuesday at 12:30 PM and can be seen on *Meadows Live!* The connections of Racing Hill and Manhattan Beach will choose their post positions, with the others drawn randomly.

Racing Hill boasted the strongest credentials in the field, having won the final of the \$500,000 Hempt Memorial and finishing second in the Meadowlands Pace and the final of the North America Cup—each of those a \$1 million event. If that grueling schedule of five tough races in little more than six weeks took anything out of him, it wasn't evident in his Adios elimination.

The son of Roll With Joe-Chasing Ideals made the front with an extended quarter pole move for Brett Miller and thwarted the first-over challenge of Pick Six to down him by 3/4 lengths. Early leader Lyons Snyder finished third.

"He's just ultra-sharp," said Tony Alagna, who trains Racing Hill for owner/breeder Tom Hill. "He felt so good coming out of the Meadowlands Pace—he was so fresh and jogged great—that I felt good about bringing him here.

"If the final had been an open draw, I probably would have preferred that he sit in so we could make the final. But with the new format this year, it's important that you get to pick your post—especially with a bunch of Burke horses making the final. You don't want to draw the 9 hole against a big entry."

The victory pushed Racing Hill's lifetime bankroll over \$770,000.

Manhattan Beach saved ground for most of the mile before Matt Kakaley sent him through a seam in mid-stretch. He held off the Lightning Lane charge of his stablemate, Fernando Hanover, to defeat him by a neck in 1:50.2, a career best. Another Daily Copy, who fronted the mile, saved show.

Kakaley said he wasn't worried about being pinned late.

"If I'd had to wait for the passing lane, he'd have got through," he said. "There was no worry there. He raced really good in the Meadowlands Pace, and he raced good today. He was sneaky good a few starts before the North America Cup. Hopefully he brings his 'A' game next week."

Burke conditions Manhattan Beach, a Somebeachsomewhere-Benear gelding who soared over \$200,000 in career earnings, for Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Bruscemi LLC, Geoffrey Lyons Mound and Wingfield Brothers.

As thoughts turned to Tuesday's draw for post positions, both camps seemed to be heading in the same direction.

"The inside here is tough to get off," Miller said. "I got away fourth today from the rail, and I was leaving just about as hard as I could. I could live with post 3, but I think I'd rather have post 4, right around

there."

Kakaley's reasoning was similar.

"I don't want the 1 or 2 hole," he said. "Probably 3 or 4."

#### THE ADIOS — TOP 10 PERFORMANCES THROUGH 50 YEARS

WASHINGTON, PA, July 27, 2016 — The Delvin Miller Adios Pace for the Orchids has provided harness racing fans with five decades of excitement, showcasing champions who have paced into history bearing the blanket of orchids bestowed the winner. Champion No. 50 will be crowned Saturday afternoon when nine top 3-year-olds vie for the orchids in the \$400,000 Adios final at The Meadows.

Which are the most memorable editions of the Adios? Here's a list, admittedly arbitrary, of the Top 10:

#### ADIOS 1, 1967 - Romulus Hanover

This Adios came down to Romulus Hanover and Best Of All. Romulus Hanover almost scratched from the championship because of a calcium deposit on his left front leg. But on this particular day the decision was made to race, and Billy Haughton's colt outmaneuvered Best Of All in 2:00.3 to win the inaugural Adios.

#### ADIOS 5, 1971 - Albatross

Albatross toyed with the field in the first division, making his move in the stretch and winning easily in 1:58.3. In the second heat it was all Albatross again, this time in 1:59.3. The combined time was a stake record. Albatross was one of the greatest, and he let it be known during this Adios. He would later become the sport's top pacing sire of all time.

#### ADIOS 6, 1972 - Jay Time/Strike Out Dead Heat

Strike Out, driven by Keith Waples, and Jay Time, with Gene Riegle aboard, came up with a big surprise. They finished in a dead heat, one of the few in stake racing history and the only one ever in the Adios. Strangely enough, neither won a heat in the event. Strike Out finished second and Jay Time third in their respective elimination heats.

#### ADIOS 8, 1974 - Armbro Omaha

Delvin Miller founded the Adios but never won it. He came as close as you could in 1974 but fell short by a whisker. Billy Haughton won another Adios with his horse Armbro Omaha. Delvin's horse, Tarport Low, was less than two inches behind Armbro Omaha at the finish.

#### ADIOS 13, 1979 - Hot Hitter

Sonsam was rated just about as unbeatable as any 3-year old-colt when he stopped by The Meadows for this Adios. It rained all day, creating a muddy surface. Hot Hitter and Herve Filion won the first heat in 156.3 while Sonsam and George Sholty were pinned along the rail and couldn't shake free. In the second heat, Sonsam broke stride briefly, tried to make up the ground but couldn't, and Hot Hitter won again. It was a memorable Adios, and Herve Filion standing in the bike in the winners' circle is a moment frozen in Adios history.

#### ADIOS 18, 1984 - Andrel

This was the first of the modern-day Adios races contested at night. It rained all evening, but Andrel was not troubled. In the first heat, the colt outdistanced Holmes Hanover in 1:56.4. John Campbell would post a better time in the final, winning in 1:54.2. It's one of eight victories in Adios finals for Campbell, the all-time leader.

#### ADIOS 20, 1986 - Barberry Spur

No local colt had ever won the Adios. There was great hope and expectation as Barberry Spur entered this Adios as a favorite. Owned by Roy Davis of Pittsburgh and Barberry Farms of Sewickley, the colt circled the track in 1:53.3 to win the first division of the stake for Dick Stillings. Division two went to Tyler's Mark and John Campbell. Barberry Spur went to the front in the final, a lead that he would not give up. The winners' circle gathering was one of the largest in the history of the track. The final heat time was 1:53.1.

#### ADIOS 33, 1999 - Washington VC

What was special about the victory of Washington VC? It was engineered by Dave Palone and remains the only Adios championship for harness racing's all-time "winningest" driver.

#### ADIOS 41, 2007 - May June Character

Seventy-one-year-old trainer Mickey Burke had never won a Pace for the Orchids at his home track; when he broke through, he did it in style. Not only did May June Character triumph in 1:51.1 with George Brennan at the helm, but Won The West and Pan Giovanni finished second and third, respectively, giving Burke an Λdios sweep. May June Character would be named Pennsylvania Horse of the Year.

#### ADIOS 46, 2012 - Bolt The Duer

Bolt The Duer sat in the pocket behind the unprecedented fractions thrown down by A Rocknroll Dream — three-quarters in 1:19.2 — then shot the Lightning Lane to score in 1:47.4, fastest mile ever on a five-eighths-mile track. Mark MacDonald drove for trainer Peter Foley.

# RACING HILL SURVIVES BRUTAL FRACTIONS, DRAWS AWAY IN \$400,000 ADIOS FINAL AT THE MEADOWS

WASHINGTON, PA, July 30, 2016 — Looped from the gate and forced into brutal fractions of 25.2/52.1—in the slop, no less—Racing Hill showed his talent and heart when he drew away from the field late and captured Saturday's \$400,000 final of the Delvin Miller Adios Pace for the Orchids at The Meadows in a career-best 1:48.4

The pocket-sitting Check Six could not improve his position in the lane and finished second, 2-1/4 lengths back, while Fernando Hanover was a ground-saving third.

Racing Hill entered the 50th edition of the Adios with the flashiest credentials, including his victory in the \$500,000 Hempt Memorial final and second-place finishes in the finals of the North America Cup and the Meadowlands Pace—each a \$1 million event. But if his rivals didn't appear up to the task of beating Racing Hill, it seemed that weather and trip might do him in.

Rain punctuated by storms—the skies cleared shortly before the Adios went off—created a surface that proved tiring to some early leaders throughout the card. And Racing Hill, the 2-5 favorite, couldn't wrest the lead from Check Six until just before the three-eighths.

"The race was not going the way I wanted it to go," said winning driver Brett Miller. "I was expecting a few more people to leave and kind of shooting for the 3 hole. When that didn't happen, I said to myself, we're in trouble."

Miller had an even stronger reaction when he realized how fast

Racing Hill was going.

"When I saw the time flash up," he said, "I wanted to throw up. I didn't think there was any way he could keep going. He goes to the half in 52.1 and keeps going. Horses don't do that."

Once he thwarted the first-over challenge of long shot Another Daily Copy, the son of Roll With Joe-Chasing Ideals opened up and had only the timer to beat. The win pushed his career bankroll to \$970,028.

Tony Alagna, who trains Racing Hill for owner/breeder Tom Hill, said he expected a swift opening half if only because his colt was facing five foes from the powerful Ron Burke stable.

"I didn't think they would let us get to the half in 55," Alagna said. "I knew they would make us earn it.

"I'm a big believer in watching drivers' body language. I was watching Brett in the bike, and he was telling me that he felt he had something left."

Alagna said he plans to give Racing Hill two weeks off before his next engagement, the Battle of the Brandywine.

Manhattan Beach took fourth and More Dragon fifth, meaning that Burke, who entered six horses in Adios 50 and saw five advance to the final, finished 2-3-4-5. Did he find that frustrating or satisfying?

"Definitely satisfying," Burke said. "My horses raced well. Racing Hill was unbelievable."

ADIOS NOTES: Miller entered Adios 50 as the leading moneywinner in the history of the event among drivers who had never won an Adios final. With the victory, he vaulted to eighth on the alltime Adios earnings list with \$562,286... Although the track was sloppy, Racing Hill matched the time of last year's winner, Dude's The Man. They're tied for the fourth-fastest Adios final... James Witherite, race caller at Tioga Downs and an accomplished jazz organist, showed off another dimension of his talent, entertaining fans as the Adios Day bugler. He included some subtle touches, such as playing the old Billy Joel hit "She's always a Woman" to introduce the Adioo Volo—a stake for 3-year-old fillies.

#### MIKE WILDER NOTCHES CAREER WIN 7,000 AT THE MEADOWS

WASHINGTON, PA, June 21, 2016 — Mike Wilder collected career win 7,000 Tuesday at The Meadows when he piloted 13-1 long shot Step Closer to victory in the 13th race.

"This means a lot to me," Wilder said. "There are a lot of guys with more wins, but 7,000 is a good number. The way I look at it, it represents a lot of hard work and dedication. I'm very thankful and blessed to have people give me great horses to drive. I get a lot of work and a lot of chances, so I'm very fortunate."

A native of Springfield, Ohio, Wilder began jogging horses when he was 8 under the tutelage of his stepfather, David Ritter, who trained Standardbreds at the Shelby County Fairgrounds. Wilder was a phenomenon at Lebanon Raceway, where he won 13 driving titles, and he captured two driving championships at Scioto Downs before moving his tack to The Meadows in 2001.

He's never worked anywhere but the racetrack — except for a brief stint as an electrician.

"My biological father is an electrician, so I tried that out for about three months," he recalls. 
"I never got shocked, and I never set anything on fire, so I must have done a good job. It didn't take me long to see that harness racing was what I wanted to do."

For Wilder, harness racing is a family affair. He works with, and drives all the horses for, his father-in-law, veteran trainer Dan Altmeyer. Wilder's wife, Heather, handles marketing and public relations for the Meadows Standardbred Owners Association (MSOA) and received the 2013 Dan Patch "Lew Barasch Breakthrough Award." Their children, Scarlett, 14, and Lauren, 13, often can be found in the paddock; Scarlett coordinates jog cart rides for patrons during MSOA "Family Fun Nights."

Wilder regards that family involvement as a considerable asset.

"There are a lot of positive vibes," he said. "Our hearts are all in this sport. They're in different parts of this sport, but it's all for harness racing. It's quite an honor to go to the barn and sit with Dan every day. He's a great trainer — look at the great horses he's developed."

At 44, Wilder intends to keep driving but can see a day when he might shift to another role.

"You'd love to do this forever," he said. "Obviously, you're dreaming if you think you can. You can't put a number on it, but I would love to drive until I'm 50. When I see the time has come to slow it down, I'll try to be a trainer. Dan said anytime I would want to pursue that, he would help me get started.

"Who wouldn't want to follow in Dan's footsteps? My kids will be in college, so I can do the Florida thing in the winter and get away from the snow. If I'm financially able to do that, it would be a great lifestyle."

#### PANTALEANO NOTCHES CAREER WIN 7,000 AT THE MEADOWS

WASHINGTON, PA, March 1, 2017 — Not many busboys in the clubhouse dining room will go on to win 7,000 harness races, yet that's just the unique career path Jim Pantaleano has taken. He got career win 7,000 Wednesday at The Meadows when he piloted PL Intimidator to victory in the eighth race.

"I just go to work — I enjoy it quite a bit — and don't think about the numbers that much," said Pantaleano, whose mounts have earned more than \$48.4 million. "It just kind of sneaks up on you."

Pantaleano was a student at Walsh Jesuit High School in Cuyahoga Falls, Ohio, when he began working in the clubhouse at nearby Northfield Park and determined that he would become a driver.

"It looked very interesting," he said, "and I thought I would give it a try. A lot of people go to the races and think driving would be neat, so I'm probably not much different in that regard. But I actually ended up doing it"

After a fling at Muskingum College (now Muskingum University) — "I took two years off from life, you might say" — Pantaleano visited Northfield's barn area and made the rounds of stables, looking for any work he could find. A sympathetic trainer, Mel Turcotte, hired him as a groom, but that didn't help him get drives.

"I got some catch drives," he recalls, "on horses that usually were unruly."

With seed money to which his father and a family friend contributed, Pantaleano claimed for \$3,000 a horse that became the foundation for his own stable. He enjoyed success in Ohio, abandoned training when he relocated to Freehold and Yonkers in 2004 and settled at The Meadows a few years ago.

These days, many of Pantaleano's assignments come from his wife, trainer Christen Pantaleano, whom her husband describes as "a brilliant woman."

"She wasn't involved with horses but took a liking to them," he said. "She taught herself everything she needed to know."

Driving for your spouse, he said, is both "good and bad."

"When her horse races good, she's happy, so then I'm really happy. When her horse doesn't perform well, she very rarely blames the driver, but she's passionate about her work, and she'll get very upset when her horses don't perform the way she would like."

For the future, Pantaleano doesn't plan any major changes.

"I really got lucky landing at The Meadows at this stage of my career," he said. "I enjoy afternoon racing. I enjoy helping my wife with her stable. My goals really are to stay healthy and earn enough money to take care of my family and do the things we enjoy doing together."

#### MERRIMAN GETS CAREER WIN 9,000 AT THE MEADOWS

WASHINGTON, PA, April 4, 2017 — Aaron Merriman, harness racing's "winningest" driver in 2015 and 2016, collected career win 9,000 Tuesday at The Meadows when he piloted DD's Comet to victory in the fourth race.

Even when he gets the opportunity for a few days off, he doesn't take it.

"One of my fears is I would lose my drives if I took a couple days off. That's not necessarily lack of confidence, but someone's always there to step up and drive your horses. Some days, I want to stay in bed and sleep, but I can't do it for fear I'd lose my horses. I know that sounds horrible; imagine what it's like to feel it."

Merriman indicated he has no long-range plans — for harness racing or anything else.

"I'm a day-to-day guy," he said. "I don't look ahead at all, although I should. I just hope my kids find something they can get as attached to as I have."

# FRESHMAN CHAMP HUNTSVILLE ROARS TO 10-LENGTH ROUT IN SEASON'S DEBUT IN PASS AT THE MEADOWS

WASHINGTON, PA, May 6, 2017 — If there were any doubts that freshman champion Huntsville would come out smoking for his 3-year-old debut, he quickly dispelled them in Saturday's \$151,280 Pennsylvania Sires Stake at The Meadows when he roared to victory by an eye-popping 10 lengths. His time of 1:50.3 in the slop not only is the fastest this year by a sophomore on a five-eighths-mile track, but it also was at least 1.3 seconds faster than the clocking of any of the other three divisional winners Saturday.

Downbytheseaside, runner-up to Huntsville is last year's Dan Patch Award voting, also fashioned a successful if less spectacular seasonal debut, scoring in 1:52.1.

Filibuster Hanover and Fear The Dragon also won splits, the latter giving Brian Brown, trainer of Downbytheseaside, a PASS double. Brown also collected a Pennsylvania Stallion Series victory with Kellys Bett.

Huntsville had qualified well for his sophomore campaign, but even trainer Ray Schnittker, who owns the son of Somebeachsomewhere-Wild West Show with Ted Gewertz, Charles Iannazzo and Steven Arnold, wasn't expecting a runaway.

"I thought he might win by a length or two," Schnittker said, "but I guess he's right back to where he was last year. He looked really good."

Huntsville quarter-poled around Highalator, opened up 5 lengths at the three-quarters and poured it on from there. Highalator, who saw his nine-race winning streak snapped, saved second, with Blood Line third.

Winning driver Tim Tetrick had mixed feelings about the huge performance of Huntsville, who now boasts \$708,724 in lifetime earnings.

"That was all him, that was Ray getting him ready," Tetrick said. "I was hoping I didn't have to go that fast. I wanted to save that for another month. He just dragged me around there — he's that talented."

Using Lasix for the first time, Downbytheseaside was efficient in victory, powering to the lead from fifth before the half for Chris Page and holding sway in a business-like manner — Page never popped his earplugs — to down the first-over Normandy Beach by 1-1/4 lengths. Boogie Shuffle earned show.

"I thought he was a little dull getting out of the gate," Brown said, "but Chris kept him really quiet. Last year we had trouble taking him off the gate. This was perfect for the first start. Everything went as easy as it could."

Country Club Acres, Joe Sbrocco, Richard Lombardo and Diamond Creek Racing campaign Downbytheseaside, a son of Somebeachsomewhere-Sprig Hanover who extended his career bankroll to \$596,016.

Their trainers indicated the next starts for Huntsville and Downbytheseaside likely will occur in two weeks in the PASS leg at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono.

Filibuster Hanover defeated both Huntsville and Downbytheseaside early last year. In fact, trainer Ron Burke once regarded him as the most promising 2-year-old in his stable. But the son of Somebeachsomewhere-Fashion Ecstasy became unfocused and willful as the year progressed and so was gelded.

He was fast and professional Saturday, moving three wide into the final turn for Matt Kakaley and downing Point Somewherelse by 1-1/4 lengths in 1:52.2, with Candell third.

"He's a lot smarter and way more manageable to drive," Kakaley said. "I think he has things figured out now. The front wasn't too good in the early races, so I just tried to get him in the middle where he could make a big move on the end."

Filibuster Hanover has earned \$133,309 for Burke Racing Stable, Joseph DiScala, Jr., J&T Silva Stables and Weaver Bruscemi LLC.

#### \$80,000 PA Stallion Series - 3-Year-Old Colts & Geldings

The Derby Day card also featured four \$20,000 divisions of a PA Stallion Series event, with wins going to Cougar Bait, Independent One, Southwind Yukon and Kellys Bett. Mike Wilder (Cougar Bait, Kelly Bett) and trainer John Butenschoen (Cougar Bait, Independent One) enjoyed stake doubles.

Cougar Bait was impressive in his seasonal debut, moving first over and grinding out a tough win in 1:55.4. Keystone Phoenix shot the Lightning Lane for second, 1-3/4 lengths back, while Cinnabar Dragon completed the ticket.

"The rail today is real heavy, and he doesn't show a whole lot of gait speed," Wilder said. "I just kind of landed where I did and planned to move when they forced my hand. In the stretch, he just paced right off. That's not the ideal trip, but it sure didn't seem to bother him."

Southwind Yukon took the final of a late-closing series at The Meadows in his most recent outing, and he kept on rolling Saturday, retaking the lead for Dave Palone and defeating the hard-used Magritte by 1/2 length in 1:54.4. Iminurblindspot completed the ticket.

"He's a big, lazy colt, only does what he has to," Palone said. "That's what I like best about him — he's very easy on himself."






# On Track Average Daily Handle




# Off-Track Average Daily Handle




# ADW - Live Average Daily Handle




# Export - Daily In State average Live Handle


