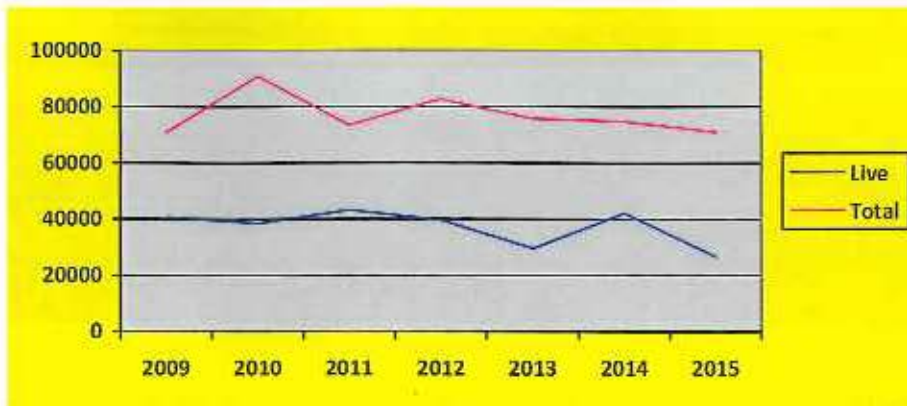

General Description of the Facility

In 2009, The Meadows Racetrack and Casino opened a state-of-the-art-facility serving as a premier entertainment destination in Southwestern Pennsylvania. However, unlike Wheeling Island and Mountaineer Park in West Virginia, where racing and gaming are held in separate buildings, The Meadows brought all of the excitement into one grand structure. The Meadows razed its outdated 1963 grandstand and during construction, temporarily operated slots and racing in separate facilities. The integrated harness racing, slots, table games, bowling, poker and various bars and restaurants into one venue has proven to be a successful business model.

The provides a larger apron area allowing for greater events on the tracks' most prominent days, including Adios Day, the Adios Eliminations, concerts, and the Triple Crown events. During the summer months, race fans watch live harness racing outside from the 500 seat open air grandstand, close up on the apron or from the Terrace Café Patio or Bistecca outdoor lounge where fans enjoy the sights and sounds of live racing, without having to peer through the glass panes of the older designed grandstand.



The track level of the facility houses a Racebook featuring 72 individual betting carrels and over 100 flat screen televisions. The Racebook also features room for 18 clerks, provides self-service wagering terminals and allows quick access to the apron and Racetrack. Also in the Racebook is Delvins snack bar. Named for harness racing icon and Meadows' founder, Delvin Miller, the snack bar offers various food options, as well as alcoholic and non-alcoholic beverages. Seating in Delvins is separated from the apron only by glass doors and windows. Directly outside of Delvins is popular open air seating, located both under cover and along the finish line.

Residing on the Racebook level are Meadows Lanes bowling lanes and the Triple Crown Events Rooms. Both of these lower level locations offer full service bars. These venues are easily accessible from the Racebook and provide opportunity for racing to acquire new fans. Meadows Lanes hosts multiple bowling leagues from the Washington area, producing new foot traffic through the Racebook. The Triple Crown Rooms (named for the Kentucky Derby, Preakness, and Belmont) and located in the former Poker Room location, allow a diverse group of people to experience the racing through gatherings, corporate events, meetings, wedding receptions, catered events, fairs and expos held in the rooms. The retractable walls between the rooms allow for great flexibility in size and configuration. With the move of the Poker Room upstairs to the Casino level, the entire Racebook level track apron, Food Court and Bistecca are open to those 18 years of age or older. Minors must be accompanied by a parent.

On the Casino level, the harness track serves as the main focal point of the property. Giant windows in the facility open to the track with outdoor dining available from both the signature Bistecca Steakhouse, as well as the main restaurant, Terrace Café. Both the 200 seat

Bistecca and the 300 seat Carvery Restaurant, renovated in May 2014, provide an elevated view overlooking the track. The 300 seat Food Court overlooks the Racetrack as well.

Another racing friendly aspect of the Casino is the ability to place wagers, not just from the Racbook, but from multiple locations on several floors. On the Casino level, a pari-mutuel window provides customers with quick and easy wagering access through a clerk on the floor. In the Food Court, several self-service terminals permit wagering access to customers. In Bistecca, during live racing, mobile tellers take wagers from customers allowing dining patrons to place wagers and watch the races from the comfort of their trackside tables. Self-service wagering terminals provide betting access to the private suites and Cigar Bar also located on the steakhouse level.

In addition to the Triple Crown Rooms and the Skyboxes overlooking the race track named for great harness racing horses or stallions, the racing theme is injected into The Meadows' premier players' room, which is named after Adios, the Delvin Miller-owned stallion and Racetracks' signature event.



In order for race fans to have easy access to the facility, there are two parking garages. One is located next to the racing entrance and the track level is just a short escalator or elevator ride down.

From the onset, and through current operations, The Meadows Racetrack and Casino's ownership continues to prove a commitment toward redevelopment of harness racing in Southwestern Pennsylvania.

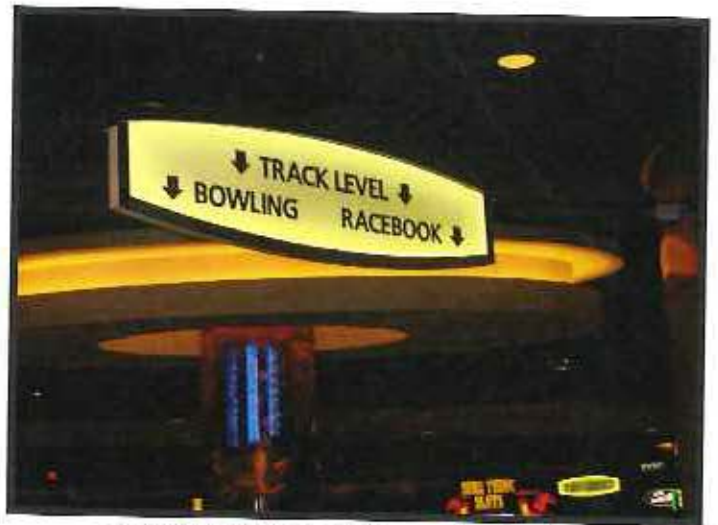

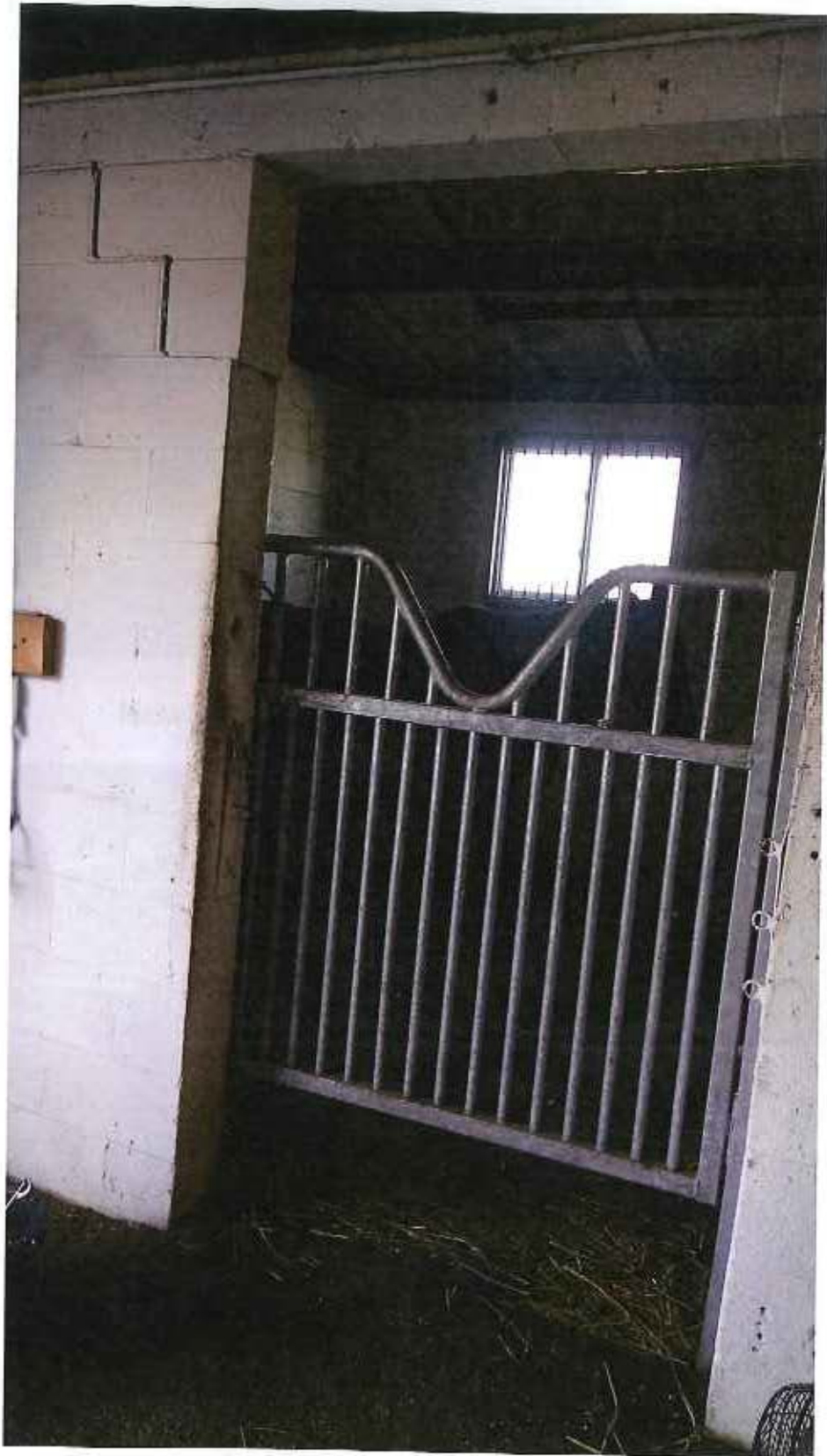

Discussion on Physical Plant

- New windows, grills, and stall gates were installed in barns 14,15,16,17
- New shedrow paving was completed in barns 14,15,16, and 17.
- New roof and awning was installed on the horsemen's trailer and on the race office.
- Paving of the main road from barn 3 to barn 18
- Paving and widening of road between barns 21 and 22
- Paving around barn 20
- Installation of fire alarm system in all buildings on the backstretch
- Video Monitoring System was installed on the backstretch in all barns and the race paddock
- Through mid-2016, **over \$11.6-million** has been dedicated to the construction and renovations at The Meadows Racetrack
- Funding has come via Act 71 monies as well as Stall Rent
- Projects yet to be completed in what is phase II of The Meadows Backstretch Improvement Plan includes paving projects. Estimated total spend will be **approximately \$12-million** upon completion of all projects

ADIOS DAY CARD AT THE MEADOWS FEATURES \$45,000 IN POOL GUARANTEES

WASHINGTON, PA, July 31, 2015 — Saturday's Adios Day card at The Meadows Racetrack & Casino will offer four multirace wagers with a combined \$45,000 in total-pool guarantees. They include:

PURE COUNTRY, BROADWAY DONNA WIN PASS FINALS, REMAIN UNBEATEN

WASHINGTON, PA, Sept. 11, 2015 — Pure Country and Broadway Donna, a pair of harness racing's rising stars, remained undefeated Friday at The Meadows when each captured a Pennsylvania Sires Stake championship.

Friday's program, which offered more than \$1.72 million in purses, included all four \$350,000 PASS finals (two actually were worth \$351,000 thanks to starting fees for also-eligibles who drew in) for 2-year-olds as well as a \$60,000 consolation in each division. Ideal Jimmy and Lagerfeld won the other championships. Trainer Jimmy Takter enjoyed a PASS championship double with Pure Country and Lagerfeld.

A recap of the program, one of the richest in track history:

\$350,000 PASS Championship — 2-Year-Old Filly Pacers

Pure Country idled outside until the field settled, then grabbed the lead for Brett Miller past the quarter.

"I didn't push her out of the gate — I wanted to see how things were unfolding," Miller said. "I had so much confidence in her I felt like she could get beat only if I did something really stupid. I pulled her ear plugs in the last turn and hollered at her, and she took off. She's never felt as good as she did today."

Diamond Creek Racing's homebred daughter of Somebeachsomewhere-Western Montana won handily — as she did in her previous five starts — in 1:51, a track record for freshman pacing fillies, a stake record and the fastest mile this year by a 2-year-old filly pacer on a five-eighths-mile track. Call Me Queen Be was a ground-saving second, 3-3/4 lengths back, with I Said Diamonds third.

Takter indicated Pure Country will be pointed to the Breeders Crown with a number of stake engagements before then.

"She's as good as they come," Takter said. "I think she's the best. She has the look, and her gait is just fantastic. Do you remember the filly I had a couple years ago, American Jewel? She reminds me of American Jewel."

Pure Country soared over \$300,000 in career earnings and became the first freshman filly pacer in PASS history to sweep all her preliminary legs and the final. She also boosted her 2015 PASS earnings to \$286,918 — most ever in a single PASS season.

\$351,000 PASS Championship — 2-Year-Old Filly Trotters

Unbeaten in seven previous starts, Broadway Donna appeared to be in a pickle when she was trapped behind the tiring leader, the previously undefeated Whitelake Hanover, as Kathy Parker wrested away the lead. But neither winning driver David Miller nor the homebred daughter of Donato Hanover-Broadway Schooner panicked.

They blew by easily in the Lightning Lane, defeating Kathy Parker by 2 lengths in 1:55.4. Womans Will rallied for show. Broadway Donna, winner of the James Doherty Memorial final, lifted her lifetime bankroll to \$466,536.

Winning trainer Jim Campbell, who conditions Broadway Donna for Fashion Farms, said he feared she would not find daylight in time.

"It was a concern," he said, "but I think, win or lose, David did the right thing. It would have been too early to pull. This filly finds a way to do it, and David did a terrific job with her. She's a professional. It's horses like her that make guys like me look better."

Campbell indicated Broadway Donna will next race at the Red Mile.

\$351,000 PASS Championship — 2-Year-Old Colt & Gelding Trotters

Love Matters, the 3-5 favorite, opened his career with six straight wins and was purchased by the powerful Takter stable before his last start. He was rolling along to his seventh when he made an inexplicable break around the final turn. Three other contenders also jumped it off at some point in the mile.

"He kind of lost his balance and was running in a little bit in the last turn," said his driver, Marcus Miller. "I'm sure Jimmy will figure it out."

Takter's disappointment lasted about 25 seconds because it was his colt, Lagerfeld, who picked up the pieces. The son of Yankee Glide-Southern Senorita, dismissed at 11-1 because of a four-race losing streak, triumphed for Yannick Gingras in a career-best 1:55.3. Sliding Home was three-quarter lengths back in second while Dupree, an also-eligible who drew in, earned show.

WASHINGTON PA, June 6, 2015 — Suit And Tie was dressed for success in Saturday's Currier & Ives open division at The Meadows, promenading through the Lightning Lane to earn a narrow victory in the \$119,565 stake for 3-year-old trotters.

Suit And Tie had won only two of his previous 21 starts and was somewhat overshadowed by his stablemate, Boots N Chains, who also started in the Currier & Ives. But John Butenschoen, who trains Suit And Tie for William Wiswell and M&L of Delaware, said the rangy son of Andover Hall-Warrawee Krisp came back a stronger horse at 3.

"Last year, he had as much talent as Boots N Chains," he said. "Mentally, he just wasn't there. At the end of the year, he started to come around. He filled out and developed mentally and physically. Today, he pretty well exploded. I was happy to see that."

In the Currier & Ives, Boots N Chains had to work hard for the lead, securing it at the three-eighths, and was pressured by the first-over Chef Lee. That set the stage for Suit And Tie's rally, as he poured through for Aaron Merriman and scored in a career-best 1:54.1. Shoot The Thrill, who was pushed four wide through the final turn, trotted wide gamely but came up a nose short while Boots N Chains saved show.

Butenschoen said his \$30,000 yearling acquisition will remain in Pennsylvania Sires Stakes and also is eligible for the Hambletonian, the Earl Beal, Jr. and the Colonial, among other stakes.

\$181,766 PASS, 3-Year-Old Colt & Gelding Pacers

In the companion feature on Saturday's special Belmont Day card, a \$181,766 PASS for sophomore colt and gelding pacers known as the Bye Bye Byrd, Lost For Words made it three straight in PASS action — and four in a row overall — when he overcame post 9 to prevail in 1:50.1

Winning driver David Miller had Lost For Words outside for the entire 27 first quarter, but Miller said he wasn't unduly concerned.

"Had there been a spot, I would have taken it," Miller indicated. "They weren't going really big. He can leave much faster. He's one of the better ones in the sires stakes, that's for sure."

Lost For Words cruised home without a serious challenge, defeating Blood Brother by 2-3/4 lengths, with Rufo third. Brian Brown, who conditions the son of Well Said-Thou Shalt Not for County Club Acres, William Robinson, Richard Lombardo and Strollin Stables, said he's unable to pinpoint the exact reason for Lost For Words' impeccable start to the year.

"Maybe he's a touch sounder — not that he was bad last year," Brown said of his \$50,000 yearling purchase. "I really can't explain it. He's not a great, big strong horse who's just coming to his own. He's just a good little horse."

But if Brown is at a loss for words about Lost For Words, that's about the only thing he's lost at The Meadows in 2015. In 15 starts at the track this year, Brown is 10-3-1 for an eye-popping .800 UTR.

He said he didn't pay Lost For Words into the North America Cup or Meadowlands Pace lest those tough tests wear him down. Instead, he's pointing his colt to the Max Hempt.

In the other division, My Hero Ron was making his first start for his new connections — trainer Ron Burke, owners Burke Racing Stable, Weaver BrusceMI LLC, Larry Karr and Frank Baldachino — who purchased him for \$130,000 at the recent Meadowlands sale. He returned immediate dividends, shooting the Lightning Lane for Matt Kakaley to triumph in 1:50.4. PV Coming Home was second, 1/2 length back, while Rise Up Now completed the ticket.

Still, it was no slam dunk, as PV Coming Home and Merriman grabbed a daylight lead with a backside burst that left My Hero Ron 2-1/2 lengths behind at the top of the stretch.

"My horse actually was loaded," Kakaley said. "Aaron's horse looked like he was getting a little weak, so I thought I could reel him in. Marcus Miller, who had been driving this horse, told me the horse is lazy. So I figured, a barn change to Ronnie, and he might wake up a little bit. And he did. Like Ronnie said last year about a filly I drove for him, 'It's penthouse or outhouse.'"

WASHINGTON, PA, Sept. 16, 2015 — When Safe From Terror surprised the field and bettors by winning the Sept. 5 Pennsylvania Sires Stakes championship at 45-1, some may have dismissed it as a fluke.

They likely won't be saying that about her any longer, as she scored her second consecutive upset, this time at 5-1, in Wednesday's \$170,000 Nadia Lobell for 3-year-old filly pacers at The Meadows — and took the overland route to do it.

Sassa Hanover wanted the lead from the rail, but she was pressured early by Divine Caroline and Storm Point, forcing her to step a lively opening half in 26.3/54.4. With all that early speed, winning driver Matt Kakaley knew the front end might collapse but wasn't sure third over was the place to be.

"I was a little worried," Kakaley said, "but I wanted to get her out in the flow of the race anyway. It worked out perfect, really, because the front end kind of fell apart off the last turn."

Safe From Terror moved four wide through the stretch to down another closer, The Show Returns, by a length in 1:50.4, a career best. Divine Caroline was full of pace but lacked room and had to settle for show.

The back-to-back upsets by the daughter of Western Terror-In A Safe Place didn't surprise Kakaley.

"I've won a lot of races with this filly, and she's always been very, very good," he said. "There was a point for a few starts where she was just okay, not great, but she was very good today."

Ron Burke trains Safe From Terror, who now boasts \$449,992 in lifetime earnings, for Our Horse Cents Stables, Stable 45 and J&T Silva Stables.

In the \$20,000 Filly & Mare Not Listed Preferred/Preferred Handicap Pace, Certified Ideal collected a front-end victory — her third in the last four starts — in 1:51.2 for Tony Hall,

trainer Randy Bendis and owners Mike Novosel, Jr., Tom Pollack, James Walton and Bendis. Do Me Honor was second, 1/2 length back, with Jaded Dream third. The 5-year-old daughter of Western Ideal-Areba's Last soared over \$400,000 in career earnings.

It was one of four wins for Hall on the 15-race card.

Mingling of Generations

One reason for the ongoing popularity of Pennsylvania fairs racing is the earnings opportunity it provides. Typically, PA Fairs Sires Stakes for 2- and 3-year-olds offer purses of about \$5,000. While that's only a fraction of the sires stake purses at the state's three pari-mutuel tracks, there are so many fair stakes that it's not uncommon for horses to turn profits for their owners with their fairs winnings alone. Says trainer/driver Steve Schoeffel:

"The fairs are a nice place to race my horses. I can make money with them and teach them how to be racehorses."

Schoeffel, of Evans City, has campaigned his horses at The Meadows and PA fairs for about 30 years and uses the Butler County Fairgrounds as his base of operations. This year at the fairs, Schoeffel won 30 races as a trainer, 14 as a driver.

Just as important as the cash is the mingling of generations on the fairs circuit, a vehicle for the exchange of information and experience across age groups. That sort of pollination, if you will, is a key factor in the perpetuation of Pennsylvania harness racing.

Stars in many sports retire in their late 30s, but that's hardly true in harness racing. This year's leading trainer (81 wins) and driver (87 wins), as he's been so many times, is 69-year-old Roger Hammer, known as the "King of the Fairs," who collected his 4,000th career victory last May at The Meadows. Those accomplishments notwithstanding, in any fairs stake, Hammer may find himself battling such younger rivals as Schoeffel, 45, and the Johnston brothers, Aaron and Shawn, whose combined age is 47.

Schoeffel has turned over many of his driving responsibilities to a protégé, 22-year-old Brady Brown, who responded by logging 45 wins — including 10 straight with Schoeffel's top horse, Royaltyhasarrived — to rank fourth in the standings.

"It's Brady's time; he's been waiting a long time to get started," Schoeffel says. "We turned him loose on all the good ones this year."

Families Working & Prospering Together

Finally, PA Fairs give families the chance to work and prosper together. Consider the Shaws, where Jason trains 'em (47 wins), his brother Chris drives 'em (61 wins), and Jason's 3-year-old son Mason owns many of them. Mason's ownership might mean little to him now, but as he grows and stays close to harness racing, he'll have ready-made entre to the business.

Much the same is true of the Johnstons who, as Schoeffel, reside in Evans City and train at the Butler County Fairgrounds. The brothers got involved in harness racing through their father, trainer Gary Johnston, and their grandfather, Charles Moses, who bought Shawn his first horse. That mare, Tremor Hanover, is approaching \$600,000 in career earnings, but Shawn Johnston wouldn't think of giving up fairs racing to concentrate on more lucrative raceway purses.

"I won in my first race at the fairs when I was 17 or 18, and I've loved fair racing since then," he said. "You're always with the same group of people, although we do try to get newcomers involved. Everyone's family at the fairs."

* * * * *

Following the fairs championships, The Meadows will take a nearly three-week break from live racing to prepare for its fall-winter meeting. Live racing returns Friday, Oct. 30, when the card begins at 12:55 PM, with a special program set for Saturday, Oct. 31, first post 11:25 AM. Those programs will complement the track's simulcast presentation of the two-day Thoroughbred Breeders Cup, always a fan favorite.

WASHINGTON, PA, Oct. 11, 2015 — Trainer Steve Schoeffel and driver Brady Brown — the master and his protégé — concluded their successful Pennsylvania Fairs season by notching a pair of fairs championships Saturday at The Meadows Racetrack & Casino.

The Meadows hosted all eight fairs finals, each worth \$25,000, to cap its current meeting. Following a break of about three weeks, the track will stage its reopening weekend with a 12:55 PM card Friday, Oct. 30, and an 11:25 AM program the following day. Those cards will complement The Meadows simulcast of the Thoroughbred Breeders Cup.

Schoeffel, a veteran of about 30 years at the fairs and raceways, has turned over many of his drives to the 22-year-old Brown, with outstanding results. Brown ranked fourth in fairs wins this season and Schoeffel fourth in training victories. On Saturday, they triumphed with Royaltyhasarrived (3cp) and Piano Rose (3ft).

Also shining was Eric Ledford, who never had driven in a Pennsylvania Fairs race in his career, but he may want to consider joining the circuit regularly. He collected wins with Worthy Jackie (2fp) Wagon Master (2cp).

"I've driven in fairs, tons of them, in Illinois and Ohio," he said. "It was always fun."

Might he consider more activity on the PA circuit?

"In the finals, maybe," he said with a smile.

A recap of the championships:

3-Year-Old Colt & Gelding Pacers — Royaltyhasarrived

The Western Terror-Her Mattjesty gelding already was a 15-time winner — including a streak of 10 straight — this year, so his victory hardly was surprising. He retook for Brown past the quarter and scored in 1:54.4, 3-1/4 lengths better than John Paul. RN Nate finished third.

"He was in the stallion series last year but hurt himself," Schoeffel said of his \$15,000 yearling acquisition. "So I didn't stake him anywhere but the fairs. I wanted to keep it easy on him and not have him chasing horses. It worked out perfect."

Virginia Schoeffel, Kathy Schoeffel and Michael Munn campaign Royaltyhasarrived.

2-Year-Old Colt & Gelding Trotters — Major Matter

With his recent victory in a Keystone Classic split, Major Matter appeared to lay over the field. That's the way the race unfolded, as the Explosive-Matter-Tahiti Springs gelding grabbed the lead early and drew off to prevail by 5 lengths over Keystone Blade. OMG Hanover earned show.

"He was very good tonight," said winning driver Rick Beinhauer, who bred and owns Major Matter with Regina Beinhauer. "He was a little sore his last start, so we had to take care of that. He's a handy little horse and drives like a Cadillac — quick as a cat out of the gate."

3-Year-Old Colt & Gelding Trotters — Simeon

As Major Matter, Simeon boasted raceway and stakes victories, and he was just as dominant, prevailing on the front end in 1:58 for trainer/driver David Wade. The pocket-sitting Winborne Hanover, last year's freshman fairs champ, was a length back in second, while Silver Sierra rallied for show.

"His ability indicated to me that he was barely good enough for the stallion series," said Wade, who owns the Andover Hall-Keystone Ariana gelding — an \$11,000 yearling purchase — with Anne Wade, Gerald Brittingham and William Peel III. "The next in the progression is the fairs. He won't race any more this year. That's a good way to go out."

2-Year-Old Filly Trotters — Waterview Hanover

Winborne Hanover came up a touch short, but his half sister, Waterview Hanover (Explosive Matter-Wherley) upheld the family honor by going three wide down the backside and scoring an 11-1 upset victory for Dick Stillings. The win was a pleasant surprise for William Daugherty, Jr., who purchased the filly for \$28,000 and trains her for Susan Dougherty.

"When I saw Dick go three wide, I was afraid she would pull herself up," he said. "She's been known to do that, although not so much in a race. I was thinking maybe fourth or fifth."

2-Year-Old Filly Pacers — Worthy Jackie

Worthy Jackie and Ledford had a tall order — find a way to defeat Unbeamievable, who had lost only once in 14 starts. But they did it, moving second over to nail the favorite by a neck in 1:59.3. The first-over Gymnast Hanover completed the ticket.

"You wouldn't think going into the race that you could ever beat that other filly," Ledford said. "But the trip worked out well, and she raced well. At the top of the stretch, I thought I had it."

Sam Beegle trains the daughter of Sharks Gesture-Jakes Lil Sis for Bay Pond Racing Stable.

3-Year-Old Filly Pacers — Crumcake

Keystone I Wish was loose on the lead but tiring because of swift fractions. That was the signal for Eric Neal to tip Crumcake three wide down the backside and take aim at the leader. Crumcake triumphed in 1:57.1, 3-3/4 lengths better than the weary Keystone I Wish, with Sandslittledragon third.

"I think Eric was concerned that everybody would leave," said Pat Medors, who trains the homebred daughter of KF St Patrick-Cookie Crombie for Mike Medors and Yvonne Medors. "He made the right move apparently, but it was a long way to come. She's been a lot of fun this year. I was tickled to death."

2-Year-Old Colt & Gelding Pacers — Wagon Master

Ledford didn't want Wagon Master on the lead early and so found himself third over. But the son of Western Terror-Free At Last K made it work despite drifting wide in the lane, scoring in 1:58.1. Well Lets See was second, 3 lengths back, with early leader Billy's Falcon third.

"They said he has one big brush, and don't use it early or you won't have anything late," Ledford said. "He was running out a little bit; on the half-mile track, he usually runs in."

Mike Gillock conditions Wagon Master for Bob Key.

3-Year-Old Filly Trotters — Piano Rose

Piano Rose stalked her stablemate, Missive, from the pocket, then blew by in the stretch to down her by 2 lengths in 1:59.1. Lucky Shiimm closed well for third.

"I was pretty confident about her," Brown said. "Last time I raced her here, she left from the eight hole pretty good. She's always been able to leave, but tonight was probably the best she's been."

Ralph Del Priore, Jr. owns Piano Rose, a daughter of Muscle Massive-Jetty's Girl.

WASHINGTON, PA, Dec. 29, 2015 — When The Meadows Racetrack & Casino kicks off its 2016 live racing season on Monday, Jan. 4, some bettors may have a little more jingle in their pockets.

That's because effective Jan. 4, The Meadows is reducing its takeout rate on trifecta wagers from 27 percent to 20 percent, and it will begin offering \$5,000 total-pool guarantees for each Pick 4. In addition to reducing the trifecta takeout, the track will retain the current takeout rate for its other wagers — 17 percent for win, place and show, 20 percent for all other exotic wagers.

With the reduction, noted Kevin Decker, director of racing for The Meadows, the track offers one of harness racing's most attractive "blended" takeout rates — the weighted average of the takeout rates for all wagers.

"This is great news for our players, and it should significantly enhance the appeal of our trifectas," he said. "We are delighted to implement these improvements to enrich the experience of our fans."

The Meadows has been offering \$5,000 Pick 4 guarantees each Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. Effective Jan. 4, in continuing cooperation with the United States Trotting Association Strategic Wagering Initiative, the track will offer a \$5,000 Pick 4 guarantee with each live card.

Minimum wager for the Pick 4 is 50 cents. Since Pennsylvania law requires a minimum per-race wager of \$2, a player wagering at the 50-cent level must bet at least four tickets.

Iron Mine Bucky hadn't raced since winning an Oct. 2 Keystone Classic split at The Meadows, and he got just the sort of journey — stuck outside — winning driver George Dennis didn't want.

"I wasn't expecting to get that rough a trip," Dennis said. "They didn't go that much early, and he got a little excited — first time out, first time in the mud. I didn't want to wrestle him back to last."

But the Hambletonian-eligible son of Explosive Matter-My Foolish Dream persevered on the outside and overpowered the leader, 2-5 favorite Hititoutofthepark. Iron Mine Bucky prevailed in 1:55.2, 1-1/2 lengths better than Steed, while Hititoutofthepark saved show.

"He really trotted strong up the backside and turned in a big mile," Dennis said. "I'm very, very pleased."

Greg Haverstick trains Iron Mine Bucky, who extended his career bankroll to \$132,023, for Iron Mine Branch LLC.

Cufflink Hanover has won three of four starts since adding hobbles, and he again looked useful and professional. He worked out a pocket trip behind Truemass Volo, then blew by him in the lane to triumph in 1:55.4. Hollywood Highway found late room for second, 2 lengths back, with Truemass Volo third.

"He's been getting lucky with his trips, and he's been racing good," said winning driver David Miller, who owns the Andover Hall-CR Savoire Faire gelding with the Enzed Racing Stable of the colt's trainer, Nifty Norman. "He seemed way sharper today than he did last week. He's coming along really nice."

\$70,500 Currier & Ives, 3-Year-Old Filly Trotters

Saturday's rain-soaked program also featured the filly division of the Currier & Ives, with Goodtogo Hanover rolling to her seventh consecutive victory. Lookin Sharp erased a sizable deficit to take the other split.

Goodtogo Hanover was away second for Brian Zendt, who moved her to the point before the quarter. The daughter of Explosive Matter-Grammy Hall held off the late challenge of the pocket-sitting Witness the Princess by 3/4 lengths in 1:56.4. Moots completed the ticket.

Goodtogo Hanover, who vaulted over \$100,000 in career earnings, is undefeated in seven outings this year, but she showed once again that she can be a handful until the gate folds.

"She was a little wild behind the gate — oh my gosh," Zendt said. "She had her head hung up on the gate for a minute. She was so mad I don't know how she didn't run. She makes you worry, but as long as you don't have her doubled up and mad, she'll be okay. She doesn't want to run. All she wants to do is get out of there."

Bill Zendt conditions Goodtogo Hanover and owns with Gary Saul.

Lookin Sharp, the 4-5 favorite, trailed the leader, Sunset Glider, by 3 lengths at the three-quarters when Matt Kakaley suggested it was time to get busy. She tracked down Sunset Glider and downed her by a neck in 1:57, with My Pink Bike third.

"Of all the horses we sent to Florida (for the winter), she's probably one of the horses who grew up and matured the most," said Tyler Butenschoen, assistant to winning trainer John Butenschoen. "I saw a big difference in her. She showed late in the year she could go with the best fillies. The more the year went on, the more she learned and the better she got."

William Wiswell and M&L of Delaware campaign the daughter of Andover Hall-Warrawee Krisp, who soared over \$200,000 in career earnings.

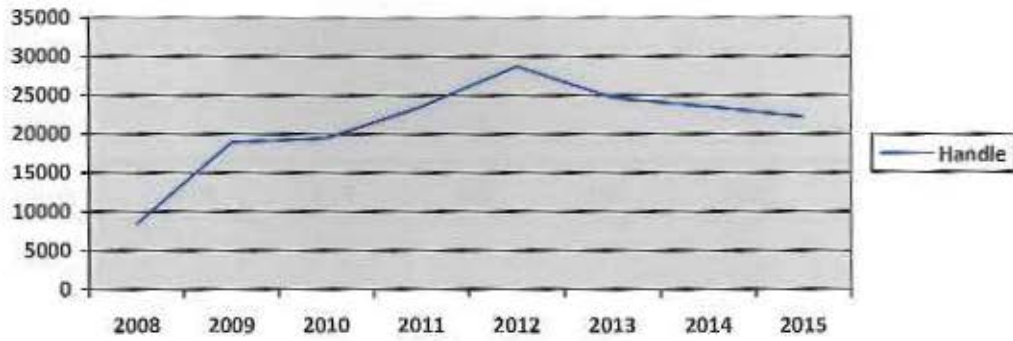

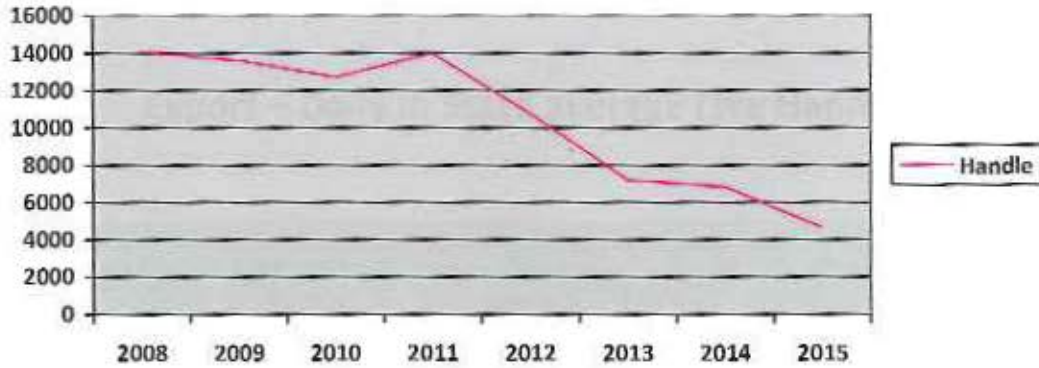

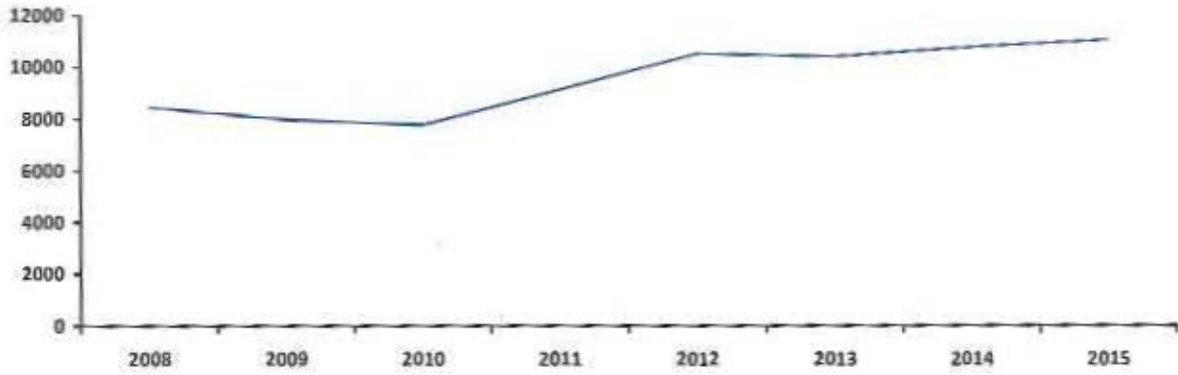
On Track Average Daily Handle



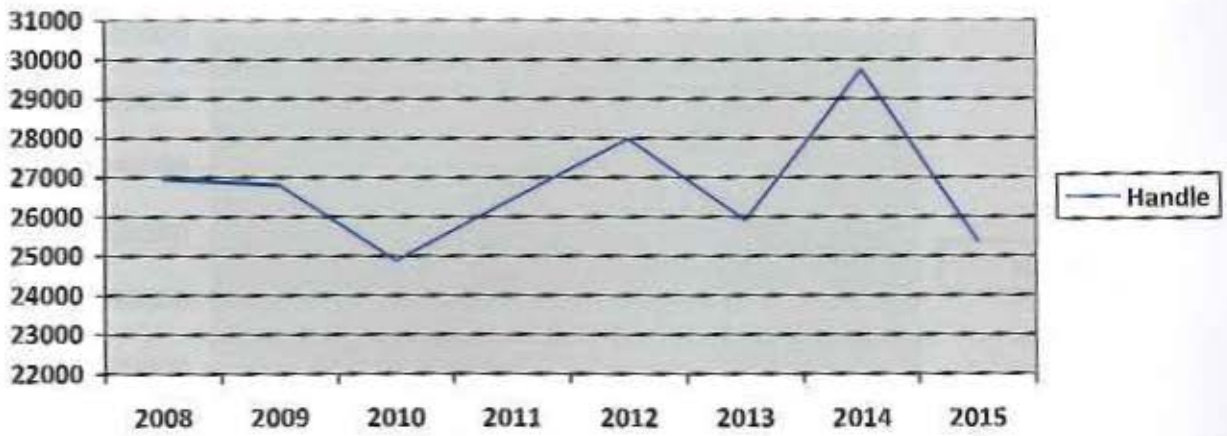
Off-Track Average Daily Handle



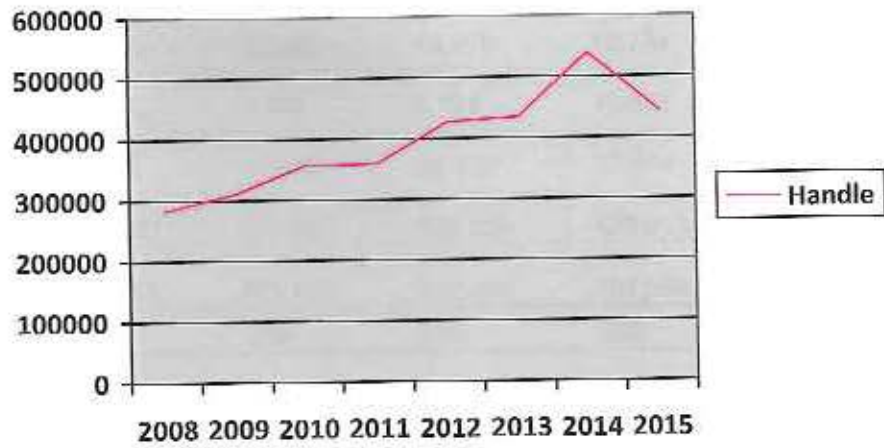
ADW – Live Average Daily Handle



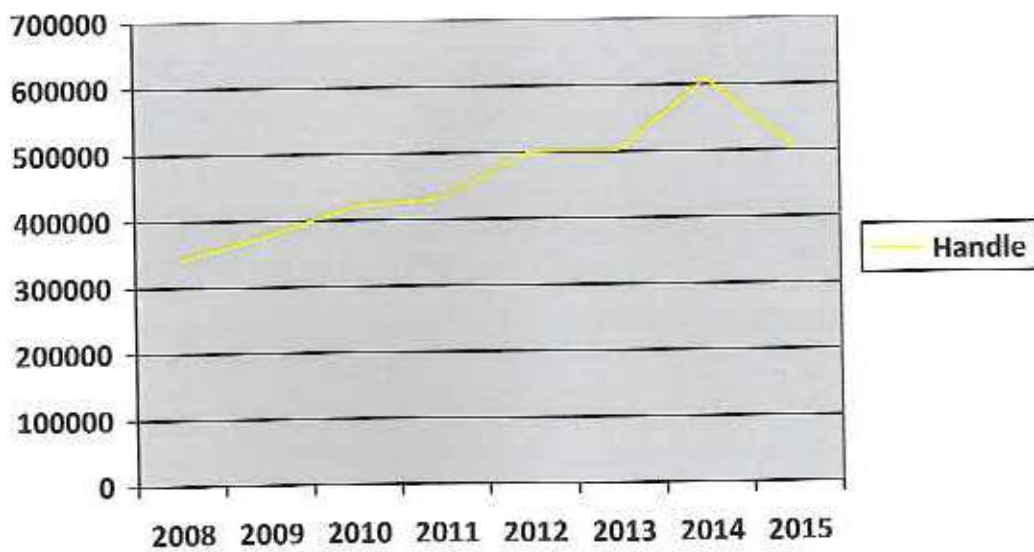
Export – Daily In State average Live Handle

- Continue initiatives that increase the maximum number of participants in a race to 10

- Regularly scheduled Guaranteed Wagering Pools along with Instant Guaranteed Wagering Pools on major carryover days (In cooperation with the United States Trotting Association's Strategic Wagering Initiative)

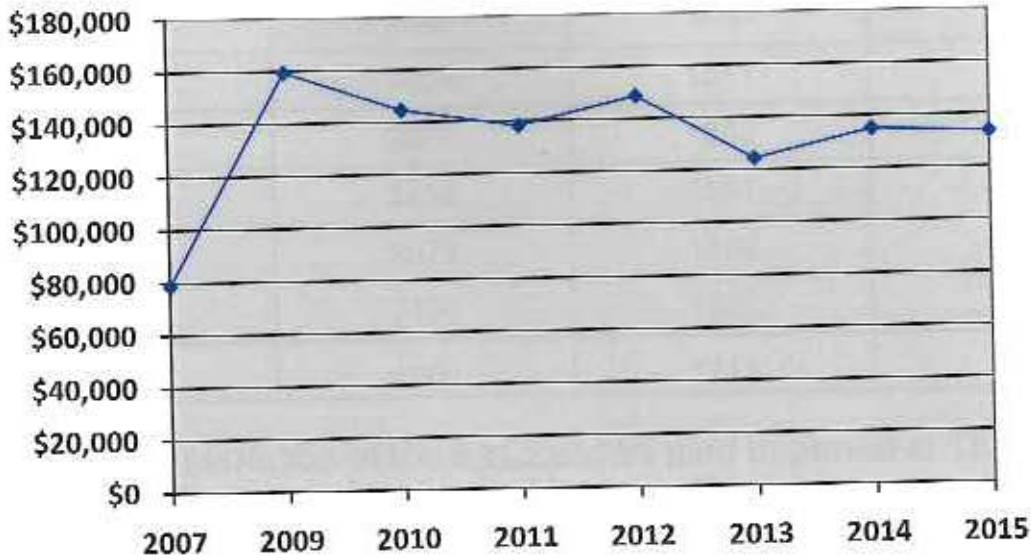

In 2015, \$23,606,763 of the \$35,232,796 paid in purses at The Meadows was earned by Pennsylvania-sired horses. This compares to \$15,950,000 of the \$32,000,000 paid in 2008.

The percent of winning favorites was 40.6% in 2015, comparing favorably to the other North American tracks. Both Pocono and Philadelphia were over 44%.

Plans to Increase Pennsylvania Sired or Owned:

- Continue funding PA Sired two and three year old Early Closing Event (Keystone Classic) – 8 Divided Races with a cost estimated at \$100,000.
- Continue writing races restricted to two and three year old PA-Sired as Preferred first choice, then PA Owned second if Sired Only do not fill. Purses will continue to have a 10% increase in the restricted events.
- Support the PA Stallion Series as events continue to grow each year.
- Continue supplemental funding for PA Sires Stakes Finals and Consolations.
- Continue strong commitment to PA Sired or Owned overnight events as class availability exists.

In 2014, The Meadows percentage of winning favorites was 41.1% compared to 40.6% in 2014. The lower the percentage means that the betting favorite is winning less of the time, theoretically increasing the average winning payoff. Typically, a track that races as many days as The Meadows will have a percentage of winning favorites in the low to mid 40% range.
