# THE STATE HORSE RACING COMMISSION MEETING MINUTES

# October 26, 2017

A public business meeting of The State Horse Racing Commission was held at the following date, place and time: FARMSHOW Complex in the Susquehanna room in Harrisburg, PA, Thursday, October 26, 2017 at 1:00 P.M.

Commissioners in attendance were: Chairman Russell Redding, Thomas Jay Ellis, C. Edward Rogers, Michele C. Ruddy, Darryl Breniser, Salvatore DeBunda, Dr. John Egloff, Dr. Corinne Sweeny, and Russell Jones by phone. Also present were Commission legal counsel Brook Duer and Jorge Augusto.

The Chair called the meeting to order. Legal counsel noted that the meeting has been advertised in accordance with the Sunshine Law. Legal counsel noted that executive session was conducted at 11:30 a.m. for discussion of potential topics: Personnel matters; attorney-client privileged communication; litigation; commission adjudications.

Chairman Redding welcomed everyone to Harrisburg.

# I. OLD BUSINESS

#### Stream Update:

Director Revington informed everyone that the commission meeting is being livestreamed by Bryan Langlois.

The Commission decided not to livestream meetings due to the significant cost factor.

## Marketing:

Ms. Eisenbeil reported on Advisory Committee updates and notified the Commission that the next meeting will be November 8, 2017. Ms. Eisenbeil informed the commission that the Commission Newsletter entitled "On the Bit" was sent out in October and the next one will be sent out January 1, 2018.

Five vendors attended or called into the RFP preconference research meeting and the committee is waiting to see how many proposals will submitted via the "Emarket place" which will close on October 27<sup>th</sup>.

# **Communication Plan:**

Director Revington informed the commission that some of the processes and procedures have been clarified. The commission staff will need to notify by phone or email the press office regarding the specifics of the interview. The commission staff is to use its discretion to determine whether to proceed with

the interview. If the Marketing Director is approached with an interview request she should contact the Bureau Directors for direction.

The Press office should be notified (if possible) in advance and draft potential releases for approval of Commission actions. The goal is to distribute upon conclusion of the meeting.

Ms. Eisenbeil introduced the 2017-2018 Communications plan with the vision to place Pennsylvania as the national leader in the equine racing and breeding industries. Along with creating awareness for the Pennsylvania horse industry we must develop and coordinate a consistent message that is adopted and used not only statewide but nationwide. A major goal is to increase awareness of horse racing and breeding in Pennsylvania.

The areas to be used in this strategy will include, economic impact, jobs, integrity, human interest and miscellaneous. Audiences will include the general public, agricultural markets, policy makers, members of agriculture educational programs, sports fans, horse followers, the wagering public, leisure markets and tourists.
